3.1	Proposed Hire Report / Incentive Plans under \$3,000 / Weekly Reclassification Report	<p>The Proposed Hire Report is a weekly report of active job postings to recruit and hire new SLCO employees. A spreadsheet of all completed job reclassifications and a list of all incentive plans under \$3,000 that were signed that week.</p> <p>The Requested Agenda Item Description should provide context for Councilmembers, staff, and members of the public to clearly understand the purpose of the agenda item, any relevant background information, and the nature of any action that is being requested.</p>
3.2	Budget Adjustment: Office of Regional Development’s Request to Recognize \$19,539,035 in Revenue and Related Expenses to Rental Assistance and Housing Stability	<p>This budget adjusts the overall ERAP 2 total from \$9,297,047 to a total of \$29,052,933.80 which is Salt Lake County's full ERAP 2 allocation. Salt Lake County is spending an average of \$1M to \$1.5M each week, and the \$9M dollar budget passed for 2022 will not keep up with demand. Major Budget changes include direct assistance increase from \$9M to \$21M. The addition of a \$450K advertising budget, to supplement the state's advertising and provide targeted advertising to neighborhoods we plan to canvass. The addition of 4 additional temporary employees to knock doors and book appointments with potential applicants, and the technological costs associated with the additional staff. We also added an additional grant program to provide housing stability services as we see evictions across the county rise to pre-pandemic levels</p>

This agreement is for the promotion of Clark Planetarium services through Bandwango’s national distribution channel with the sales of show vouchers to the County’s Northrop Grumman IMAX Theater and Hansen Dome for one-year.</p>

DBHS will present the new and notable changes to the area plan along with summary information regarding budgets and individuals served for Council approval.
3.5	Repeal Countywide Policy 1400-3	Countywide policy 1400-3 is outdated and should be retired. The areas covered in the policy are now part of the IT Standards published by the County's Information Technology Division. Policy 1400-3 is no longer needed.
