4.1	The Proposed Hire Report / Incentive Plan \$3,000 and Under / Weekly Reclassification Report	The Proposed Hire Report is a weekly report of all active job postings that were opened the prior week, to recruit and hire new SLCo employees. The Incentive Plan Report is a list of all recently approved incentive plans that total \$3,000 or less. The Weekly Reclassification Report is a report of all job reclassifications that were completed in the last week.
4.2	Budget Adjustment: The Sheriff’s Office requests to move \$127,412 salary and benefits from the Jail to the Sheriff’s Office due to the reclassification of a Deputy II to a civilian Communication and PR	This request is to move funding associated with the reclassification of a Deputy II FTE to a civilian Communications and PR FTE. This reclassification crosses Sheriff’s Office Organizations moving the funding and FTE from 9120 to 9130. Funding is for the remaining four months of 2023 and will be annualized in 2024
4.3	Budget Adjustment: Clark Planetarium requests a technical adjustment to reallocate indirect costs from their main organization code to various sub-department organization code.	Clark Planetarium is requesting a technical budget adjustment to reclassify indirect costs to the administration sub-department. This is a net neutral budget adjustment.
4.4	Budget Adjustment: Public Works requests to add \$1,116,129 to their revenue and expense budgets for multiple projects that will be fully reimbursed by the Municipal Services District.	The Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District (GSLMSD) recently added \$1,116,129 to the Public Works Engineering (PWE) project budget as follows: EFCMC190023, White City Segoe Lily Drive Road Improvement, \$479,006, for construction EFCCB180002, 6200 S Misty Way Intersection, \$200,000, for construction EFCMC210012, SR-48 SW btw 8629 to 8662 W, \$237,123, for construction EFCMC230011, Brighton Bridge Improvements, \$200,000 for design, permit, and construction improvements This budget adjustment is budget neutral because project expenses will be reimbursed by the GSLMSD.

<p>4.5</p>	<p>Budget Adjustment: This is a Technical Adjustment to Allocate \$259,577 from the \$3M set aside to the 2024 Baseline Budgets for Three County Organizations.</p>	<p>HR completed this set of pay review requests and submitted its recommendation to the \$3M Working Group for its consideration and was approved by the group after the June Adjusted Budget was completed. The effective date of the pay increases ranges from April 30 to July 23, 2023.</p> <p>This request is to address the budget impact on the Assessor, DA, and PW Flood Control &amp; Engineering.</p> <p>The total annualized budget impact is \$260 K, including salary and benefits. <p>6.1</p>	<p>Legislative Intent to establish additional criteria for evaluating funding requests from the Community Councils</p>	<p>1) Consistent with County ordinance, requests for contributions by a community council should be made in writing to the Council, with a copy to the Mayor, prior to September 30th of each year so that they might be considered as a part of the County's budget process, as well as the budget process for the Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District. A link to the funding application will be provided to each community council.</p> <p>2) As a part of the community council's funding request, it should provide a copy of its most recently approved budget, which shall contain all of the following information: statements from all applicable bank accounts maintained by the community council; a proposal describing in detail how the community council intends to spend contributions received from Salt Lake County for public purposes; documentation that the budget was reviewed and approved by the community council's designated budgetary authority; and, within ninety days following the close of the community council's fiscal period, a detailed financial statement setting out community council revenues and expenditures during that fiscal period.</p> <p>3) Council staff designated to serve as a liaison to recognized community councils will coordinate with recognized community councils to appear before the County Council during the month of September for the purpose of receiving funding requests and discussing priorities from each community council.</p>
