Job Growth by State May 2017-2018, Seasonally Adjusted







Key Stats


- 25 miles

- 37% increase in jobs statewide 2010-2016
- Annual growth averages of 10.2%







Population Growth Annual percent change 2016-2017









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
Salt Lake County Population as a Percent of State



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Salt Lake County Net Migration



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
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Salt Lake County Components of Population Change




