Today is World Spay Day: our chance to decrease the number of homeless pets through spaying and neutering. According to statistics from the ASPCA, the Humane Society, and other animal rescue services, roughly 6.5 million animals enter shelters each year. Many shelters and rescues are continually at capacity because there are so many unwanted animals.

To reduce the number of homeless pets, Salt Lake County Animal Services recommends spaying and neutering all pets in your home; unsurprisingly, this prevents unplanned pregnancies and surrenders to shelters. Spayed and neutered pets are also less likely to wander from home and there are proven health benefits such as extending your pets' lives and reducing the risk of some types of cancers.

Here at Salt Lake County, our Animal Services team is committed to spaying and neutering in several ways:

- 1. First, all adoptable animals are spayed or neutered before they are adoptable, so you have peace of mind that your new friend is protected.
- 2. Second, they offer <u>Free Feline Fix appointments</u> on the first and third Thursday of each month for all cats within their jurisdiction. The Free Feline Fix includes a spay or neuter, rabies vaccine, FVRCP vaccine, and microchip for \$0! The next Free Feline appointments are **this Thursday**.
- 3. And, if you aren't in their jurisdiction—which can be found under Spay and Neuter on the <u>Clinic Services page</u>—they provide a <u>spay and neuter resource</u> <u>guide</u> for you to find other available low-cost spay and neuter programs throughout the state.

Join us this World Spay Day by committing to spaying and neutering your pets and keeping animals out of the shelter, and by spreading the word! Additionally, if you have room, consider helping us clear the shelter by <u>adopting your next best friend via Salt Lake County Animal Services</u>.

# March into May

General registration is now open for Healthy Lifestyle's March into May! Employees must <u>register</u> between now and **March 10** to participate.

### What is March into May?

March into May is a 6-week team challenge where teams of 4–12 walkers and solo walkers are invited to participate. The goal is to walk an average of 7,000 to 10,000 steps a day to meet the CDC's physical activity guidelines. This is a friendly and social competition with divisions based on similar activity levels. There are three divisions with one winning team from each.

### Who Can Participate?

All Healthy Lifestyles participants and SLCo employees are eligible to participate. If you are unable to walk during the challenge, you are encouraged to convert your movement into steps.

#### **How Does It Work?**

Participants must record 75% of steps and complete the post-survey to receive 100 points. WellSteps will send weekly notifications to input steps during the 6-week program. WellSteps will display personal steps, team steps, and calculate the leaderboard to show your team's standing against your coworkers.

\*Note: The March into May challenge will run from March 27–May 7.

## Professional Development
