As temperatures continue to rise, it's important to prioritize our health and well-being during the hot summer months. That's why this week we want to highlight the efforts of Salt Lake County's Aging & Adult Services in helping seniors stay cool and safe through their Cool Zones program.

Cool Zones are air-conditioned indoor spaces open to the public, strategically located throughout the valley at county senior centers, libraries, and recreational facilities. These zones offer a welcome respite from the heat from now until **October 15**, providing a place to cool off, hydrate, and stay safe from heat-related illnesses. Whether you're an older adult seeking relief or know someone who may benefit from the Cool Zones, an <u>interactive map</u> is available to help identify the locations in your neighborhood.

In order to stay safe during the excessive heat, Aging & Adult Services advises everyone, especially older adults, to follow some essential tips:

- Remember to stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water and avoiding alcohol and caffeine.
- Dress appropriately with light-colored and lightweight fabrics.
- If possible, stay indoors during the hottest hours of the day, between noon and 3 p.m.
- Avoid strenuous activities and be aware of the warning signs of heat-related illness, such as dizziness, nausea, rapid heart rate, chest pain, and difficulty breathing.
