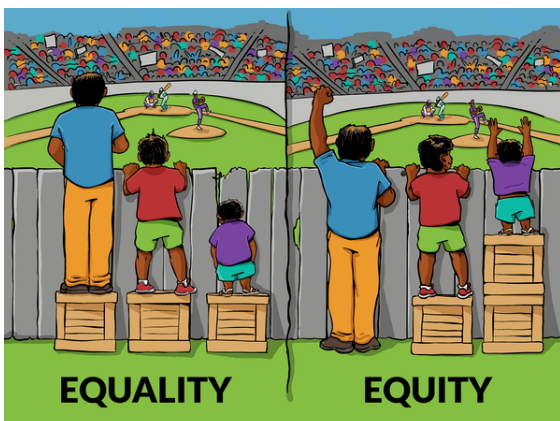

Tomorrow is International Women's Day: a global celebration of the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women and a call for action for women's equality. International Women's Day has been celebrated for over a century with the first gathering in 1911.

This year's theme is Embrace Equity to illustrate why "equal" opportunities aren't enough. Gallup defines equity as "fair treatment, access and advancement for each person in an organization." But the definition doesn't stop there; equity takes into account additional factors that affect opportunities so that all systems can meet people's unique needs without giving one person an unfair advantage over another. Everyone starts from a different place and travels a different path, so equity is necessary to create true inclusion.



This graphic created by Angus Maguire for the Interaction Institute for Social Change perfectly captures the difference between equity and equality. While equality gives to everyone equally, the result often leaves some at a greater advantage than others. 2023 Smart Gov Fund

Are you and your team constantly striving to find new and innovative ways to make your work more efficient and effective? The Smart Government Fund, through the Office of Data & Innovation (ODI), is specifically designed to support and bring to the life the very ideas that have been on the back burner, just waiting for the right opportunity. With the Smart Gov Fund, your innovative ideas can finally become a reality.

For 2023 there is \$500,000 allocated to encourage, support and fund ideas coming directly from employees that could save the county money, time or enable improved/more efficient services. The office of ODI will assist employees with ideas throughout the application process, so no need to be nervous! Each project has a funding opportunity up to \$100,000.

March into May

General registration is now open for Healthy Lifestyle's March into May! Employees must [register](#) by **this Friday, March 10**, to participate.

What is March into May?

March into May is a 6-week team challenge where teams of 4–12 walkers and solo walkers are invited to participate. The goal is to walk an average of 7,000 to 10,000 steps a day to meet the CDC's physical activity guidelines. This is a friendly and social competition with divisions based on similar activity levels. There are three divisions with one winning team from each.

Who Can Participate?

All Healthy Lifestyles participants and SLCo employees are eligible to participate. If you are unable to walk during the challenge, you are encouraged to convert your movement into steps.

How Does It Work?

Participants must record 75% of steps and complete the post-survey to receive 100 points. WellSteps will send weekly notifications to input steps during the 6-week program. WellSteps will display personal steps, team steps, and calculate the leaderboard to show your team's standing against your coworkers.

**Note: The March into May challenge will run from March 27–May 7.*
