

Permit Reference Sheet

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| Construction General Permit (CGP) | Projects over 1 acre or part of a common plan development. SLCo projects require CGP coverage within 50 feet of a waterway. CGP coverage requires SWPPP, NOI, and NOT. Click here for more information. |
| Flood Control Permit | Projects within the right-of-way or 20 feet of the top bank of a flood control facility. Click here for more information and facility list. |
| PGP10 Stream Alteration Permit | Waterway projects less than 300 linear feet involving a perennial, ephemeral, or intermittent stream. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' PGP-10 is a single application for state approval and authorization under section 404 of the Clean Water Act. |
| Excavating Permit | Permit required for any excavating within any Metro Township or Unincorporated Salt Lake County right-of-way. |
| FEMA Flood Plain Development Permit (FDP) | Permit required for all alterations to buildings, landscape, grade, service, or any other improvements of all properties within the FEMA floodplain hazard area . |
| USACE Nationwide 27 Permit Aquatic Habitat Restoration | Waterway, wetland, and riparian restoration projects greater than 300 linear feet involving tidal and non-tidal streams. Click here for the Nationwide Permits page. |
| FFSL General Permit | Permit required for projects involving the beds of Bear Lake, the Great Salt Lake, Utah Lake, the Jordan River, the summer channel of the Bear River, and portions of the beds of the Green and Colorado Rivers. |
| Dewatering Permit | Permit required for in-stream dewatering, surface area dewatering, groundwater dewatering, and hydrostatic testing. Any dewatering discharge that is land-applied and does not reach state waters or the storm drain is not regulated. |
| Building Permit | Permit required for expanding, remodeling, or constructing a building or structure, or structure utilities. Check local city regulations for specific requirements. |
| Grading Permit | Permit required for any excavation, grading, or earthwork construction including fills and embankments. Check Appendix J of the International Building Code for exceptions. |
