00:03	1. Welcome from Sheriff Rivera
00:28	Judge Brendan McCullagh motioned to approve the December Minutes. Jim Bradley second the motion. All were in favor.
00:56	2. COVID19 Response and Interim Updates
01:05	a. Law Enforcement
01:13	Chet Ellis: A dashboard was created to show PPE and staffing levels throughout the county. Submitted Alternative Housing Option that was approved. Provides a hotel room option for staff that is unable to return home after shift due to COVID-19.
06:41	Sheriff Rivera: UPD has been updated to do their regular duties with a stress on social distancing. The community has been supportive on following the rules. They are working on getting a stock on PPE.
09:04	b. Community Supervision
09:18	Kele Griffone: They have moved their pre-trial screeners from the jail to their main office. They are still operating 24/7 remotely. Next week they will be providing online classes to help bridge the gap for the Community Supervision.
12:52	c. Jail Operations
13:19	Chief Matt Dumont: The Jail has been active in trying to limit exposure to COVID-19. They have limited visiting dramatically. Phone contract providers have provided for free 3 phone calls per week to the prisoners.
17:40	d. Prosecution
17:51	Will Carlson: March 2020 vs March 2019 went up by 7% in the number of cases submitted for screening. Continuing to balance the interest in public safety and public health on who we ask warrants to be issued for.
19:11	e. Public Defense
19:18	Rich Mauro: They have taken a face-to-face system and made it remote within 2 weeks. Working with DA's office on release of individuals from jail. The big challenge is helping the individuals being released transition to safe a environment.

23:49	Pam Vickrey: Developed an expedited screening process. They are struggling with the privacy of phone conferencing. She believes the video conferencing will be better. The numbers for detention are down.

26:15	Judge Mark Kouris: They were able to get everything online in one week, when they thought it would take 6 months. What they would like to do is have the prisoners have contact with their lawyers by phone prior to their court date. This will help expedite court proceeding process.
34:37	g. Justice Court
34:44	Judge Brendan McCullagh: All of the courts are now on an amended video schedule. West Valley is addressing the domestic violence cases, which have increased due to quarantine.
40:00	Judge Clem Landau: They have been successful at implementing their “new normal” and have set up the mobile courthouse for individuals unable to attend on WebEx.
