Meeting Materials: Jail Resource Reentry Program

Karen Crompton presented on the need for a program that addresses individuals who are unpredictably released from jail. Such individuals endure challenges that result in additional incarcerations. A group came together, spoke on goals, and put together data for analysis. The Salt Lake County Resource Re-entry Program will provide a short-term, temporary location to wait for critical need services that can be administered within and under several hours. This program is funded by the BJA Grant, the county will match the grant amount, and ARPA funds over the next 3 years.
