Whereas, the “Salt Lake Countywide Water Quality Stewardship Plan (WaQSP), 2009” is an update of the existing Area-Wide Water Quality Management Plan, which was sponsored by the Salt Lake County Council of Governments and Salt Lake County in the late 1970’s; and,

Whereas, the WaQSP is written and directed toward the development and completion of specific implementation activities designed to restore and protect water quality in the Salt Lake Countywide Watershed; and,

Whereas, Salt Lake County Council recognizes the importance of water quality planning and stewardship activities throughout Salt Lake County; and,

Whereas, significant opportunities exist to protect and improve water quality and watershed function in Salt Lake County; and,

Whereas, Salt Lake County, through its Engineering Division of its Public Works Department, has worked collaboratively with various stakeholders to implement water quality enhancement projects in the past and anticipates further collaboration; and,

Whereas, Salt Lake County commends the work of its Engineering Division, but recognizes the need for a wide range of policies, planning, and implementation activities researched and proposed by many agencies as necessary to maintain and improve water quality and watershed function;


Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Salt Lake County Council supports the policies and recommendations contained in the “2009 Salt Lake Countywide Water Quality Stewardship Plan”; and,





Whereas, SLCOG has worked collaboratively with various stakeholders to implement water quality enhancement projects in the past and anticipates further collaboration; and,


